FORT ETHAN ALLEN

As part of the OGCA-backed county project to mark and interpret the historic Civil War site, archeological work is being done in anticipation of the development of a final site plan. The plan is to be presented to the neighborhood project Steering Committee to review in advance of any final decisions about the placement of project features that will include an historic marker, a bas-relief map of the fort, and a replica gun emplacement.

The flagging now on site will be removed as it is mapped and recorded. The county has teamed up with H-B Woodlawn's

American History classes to take part and follow the archeological work.



County Review of Cell Tower

The county advised us of a five-year review of a use permit for the 110-ft. telecom tower located at N. Old Glebe Road and Military Road. No changes were proposed. The use permit was originally approved in 1992, and renewed in 2001, 2002, 2003, and 2006 with no issues identified.

SCAMS

There have been several instances of people coming into the neighborhood to sell firewood or to cut trees after storms. Police officers repeated some general instructions:

1. Be aware of suspicious strangers in the neighborhood.
2. Ask for a permit if a solicitor comes to your door.
3. Call the police if you are not satisfied.

ARLINGTON ALERT

Arlington Alert is a message system that allows the county to contact you during an emergency by sending text messages to your e-mail address, cell phone, text pager or BlackBerry. When an emergency occurs, the county will notify you with up-to-date instruction on where to go, what to do, or what not to do and other important information. Sign up at: www.arlingtonalert.com.



TIPS FOR WINTER

Get a kit. For your home: three days' food and water; a battery-powered and/or hand-crank radio with extra batteries; and a family emergency plan. Add a first aid kit, needed medications, blankets and warm clothing, supplies for members of your household with special needs, and pet items.

For your car: bottles of water and food bars, bag of sand or kitty litter to provide traction under tires, hats, gloves and blankets, and cell phone charger.

For your office: bottles of water and food bars and a radio to hear local information about whether it is safe to travel. Officials may advise staying in place until it is safe to travel.

Make a plan. Choose an out-of-town relative or friend to be your family's point of contact for emergency communications. Decide on a meeting place if your family cannot return home because of closed roads. Discuss with your family what you would do in case of severe weather.

Stay informed. Listen for up-to-date information from your local media and emergency officials.
